even though my Hindi was not so good. I just pushed it. Prabhupada then said, "Ok, so you take some dictation".

Prabhupada liked the way I answered those letters and he gave me another pile of Hindi and Bengali letters to reply. Prabhupada would give me the points to reply, I would write them out by hand and Prabhupada would sign them.

One day Prabhupada was on the roof having a massage and I took some letters to him. Prabhupada was sitting in the sun and Hari Sauri Prabhu was giving him a massage. I said to Prabhupada, "Srila Prabhupada, I brought the replies to the letters." Prabhupada asked me to read them and when I finished, he signed them.

Prabhupada was sitting on a wooden plank and I was sitting on the floor just watching him have his massage. All of a sudden Prabhupada started speaking to me. "Many many lifetimes you have been trying to enjoy and you can see that you are still not satisfied, so offer this life to Krsna. It is only one lifetime you are offering to Krsna and even if nothing is accomplished, it is only one lifetime out of so many, so what is the loss? You just offer this life to Krsna."

He then said, "Don't get entangled with any woman. This material nature is a prison house of sex desire. This is a *maithunagara*. Everyone here is tied down by this desire for sex life. Sex life is the chain and you have to overcome this desire to get out of material nature. As long as you have this desire, you are bound by the laws of material nature. So, if you want to get out of this material nature, you have to overcome this desire."

Prabhupada continued to explain, "Sex life is like a camel eating thorns. The camel eats the thorns which cuts his mouth and tongue to pieces and it starts to bleed. The camel then tastes his own blood and thinks, "How delicious these thorns are. They taste so nice." Prabhupada continued, "Sex life is like that. He is losing his life's vitality, the very essence of his body, and he thinks, "Oh, how relishable this sex life is, how enjoyable it is.""

Prabhupada spoke to me in this way for about fortyfive minutes giving me many analogies one after another. When I left and was walking down the stairs, I realized Prabhupada wanted me to become a sannyasi. He wanted me to surrender to Krsna completely. I was not even initiated at that time but I could understand Prabhupada wanted me to surrender to him completely. Prabhupada gave me initiation during the Gaurapurnima festival and he very mercifully gave me first and second initiation together.

That evening all the devotees who had received initiation came to see Prabhupada to give him the dakshina they had collected. I was feeling very bad because I had not collected any dakshina for Prabhupada. I had been busy all day serving Prabhupada and did not have any time to go out and collect.

When everyone left Prabhupada's room, I said to him, "Srila Prabhupada, I feel very bad. I do not have any dakshina for you." Prabhupada looked at me and said with a smile, "That's all right. You just offer this life as your dakshina." I was very happy and thought to myself, "Yes Srila Prabhupada, I am offering this life to you, I am offering my entire self to you."

Prabhupada also made me his secretary. He told me, "So from now on you will be my Secretary for Indian Affairs and you can move into the next room." Srila Prabhupada's servants used to stay in the rooms next to Prabhupada. Hari Sauri Prabhu was Prabhupada's personal servant and Pradyumna Prabhu was his sanskrit editor, so they stayed in the room next to Prabhupada and Prabhupada's secretary had the room after that.

Tamal Krishna Maharaja was Prabhupada's secretary. Prabhupada called him and told him that he had asked me to be his secretary and he wanted me to stay with him. Tamal Krishna Maharaja was very happy to have me and was extremely kind to me. He took me under his wings and trained me up.Tamal Krishna Maharaja used to be quite heavy in those days. I remember one morning I was feeling very tired and was lying on my bed. It was after mangal arati around 6.00-6.30am. Tamal Krishna Maharaja came into the room and saw me sleeping. He woke me up and started chastising me for sleeping in the morning.

I tried to explain to him that I was feeling very tired but the more I tried, the heavier he became. Finally I gave up and said, "All right, from now on I will not sleep in the morning." Tamal Krishna Maharaja then said, "Yes, that's the right spirit. You have to learn to be submissive."

PRABHUPADA PASTIMES

In the last series of Guru-maharaja's pastimes with Srila Prabhupada, Guru-maharaja explained how he first saw Srila Prabhupada at Allahabad and then met with him while travelling on the train from Allahabad to Calcutta. Now Guru-maharaja describes how he began serving Srila Prabhupada and became his personal servant.

Srila Prabhupada stayed in Calcutta for three days. It was a wonderful time and I was trying to be with Prabhupada all the time. There were a lot of restrictions in seeing Prabhupada but I had access to his room, so I was trying to be with him as much as I could.

One evening Srila Prabhupada was giving darshan and many important people came to see him. When arati began in the temple, Srila Prabhupada told everyone to attend arati. I left Srila Prabhupada's room and went to the arati along with everyone else. Arati began but I started to think, "I can attend arati any time but now that Prabhupada is here, I should be with him."

I knocked on Srila Prabhupada's door and he asked me to come in. When I entered I saw Srila Prabhupada

was counting the money people had given him as pranami. I asked Prabhupada, "Will you initiate me?" Prabhupada said, "Yes, sure. I will give you initiation during the Gaura-purnima festival."

At first I could not understand. I wondered, "Srila Prabhupada is a sadhu, why is he counting money?" I immediately brushed this thought aside by thinking, "I am not able to judge a pure devotee like Prabhupada. Whatever he does is perfect, whatever he does is for Krsna."

Prabhupada was still counting the money, but looking at me from the corner of his eyes he asked, "So what happened? You did not go to the arati?" I said, "Srila Prabhupada, I thought I would come and stay with you." Prabhupada replied, "OK, sit down then." Prabhupada finished counting the money, stacked it neatly and put it into his drawer.

Both Prabhupada and I were silent for a short while and then I asked Prabhupada, "Will you initiate me Srila Prabhupada?" Prabhupada replied, "Yes, sure. I will give you initiation during the Gaura-purnima festival."

I had been hesitant to ask for initiation because I was thinking what would happen if Prabhupada didn't want to give me initiation. I felt so fallen I thought Prabhupada may not want to accept me as a disciple. However, when Prabhupada gave me his assurance he would initiate me, I felt extremely happy.

Srila Prabhupada went to Bhubaneswar from Calcutta. I could have gone with him but I decided to stay in

Calcutta because I was in the middle of printing a book. I had collected Srila Prabhupada's Bengali articles from the Gaudiya Math and was printing them into a book. (This book has now been printed in English as "Renunciation Through Knowledge.") I wanted to complete this printing and present the book to Prabhupada when he returned to Mayapur.

Prabhupada returned to Mayapur and it was ecstatic. There were a lot of devotees because it was just before Gaura-purnima festival. When Prabhupada arrived he got out of the car at the main gate and walked to the temple. The devotees were wild with kirtan. They were dancing all around Prabhupada and he was in the centre just gliding through.

There were devotees on top of a building and they were showering flowers on Prabhupada as he walked by. It was such an ecstatic sight. The devotees were feeling intense emotions towards Srila Prabhupada. I could not tell whether they were laughing or crying.

One day I went to Calcutta for printing the book for Prabhupada. It was still not ready which was very frustrating for me. I had to return to Mayapur emptyhanded. I returned to Mayapur the next morning and some devotees told me that Prabhupada had been asking for me.

There was a darshan with Srila Prabhupada on the lawn

in front of the Lotus Building and Prabhupada had asked, "Where is that boy who joined recently?" Srila Prabhupada was enquiring about me. I felt this was the most glorious event in my entire life. As soon as the devotees told me this. I just ran to Prabhupada's room.

I entered Prabhupada's room and said, "Prabhupada, you were looking for me?" "Yes", said Prabhupada, "Where did you go yesterday?" I then told Prabhupada that I had gone to Calcutta to supervise some printing and Prabhupada asaked, "What happened? Is the book not ready?" I said, "No Prabhupada", and he told me, "Then what is the use? If you went to Calcutta but you didn't get the book printed, then what is the use of going?"

We used to live on the boundary wall in those days. There was no bathroom so we took bath under a row of hand-pumps in a cemented area and a barber used tocome there to shave us. It was a couple of days after I had last spoken to Prabhupada and I was in the middle of having a shave when Bhavananda Maharaja came to me and said that Prabhupada wanted to see me. Prabhupada wanted to see me! Somehow I quickly took my bath and just ran to see Prabhupada.

Prabhupada asked me, "Do you know how to write Hindi?" I immediately said, "Yes Srila Prabhupada",

Krsna's Pastimes in the Puranas Seminar Class One: "Krsna and Radharani's Appearance"

"Krsna's pastimes are like a play. They

are known as lila which means activities

done out of His own sweet will."

The following is the first in a series of six classes given by Guru-maharaja in his seminar "Krsna's Pastimes in the Puranas" at Mayapur Gaura Purnima Festival 1992.

This seminar is a compilation of Krsna's pastimes from selected *Puranas*. *Srimad Bhagavatam* is the main source of Krsna's pastimes, but a lot have been described in the *Brahma Vaivarta Purana* and *Harivamsa*. *Brahma Vaivarta Purana* has one section called *Krsna khanda* which deals exclusively with

Srila Rupa Goswami, Sanatan Goswami and Srila Jiva Goswami also wrote on Krsna's pastimes quite extensively. Jiva Goswami

describes Krsna's pastimes in his Gopala Champu and Rupa Goswami wrote a number of

Krsna's pastimes.

dramas such as Vidagdha-Madhava, Lalita-Madhava and Dana Keli Kaumudi. Srila Raghunatha Das Goswami also wrote a drama named Dana Keli Cintamani.

Krsna's pastimes are like a play. They are known as lila which means activities done out of His own sweet will.

Sometimes we find contradictions in the writings of different *acaryas* on Krsna's pastimes. For example, *Brahma Vaivarta Purana* describes Radharani appeared as the daughter of King Vrsabhanu and Kirtida. However, Rupa Goswami, in *Lalita-Madhava*, describes that Radharani was born as the daughter of Vindya mountain.

When Bhaktisiddhanta Sarasvati Thakur was asked why such contradictions are in the scriptures, he explained it was due to "Kalpa bhed." Krsna's pastimes take place in different ways in different kalpas.

Therefore, when we see any contradiction, we have to understand that that pastime is from a different *kalpa*. The details may differ, but the

underlying principle is the same. The pastimes generally follow the same pattern, but some details may appear to be different. It is the same in our daily lives. The pattern of our days may be the same everyday, but each day is different

WHY KRSNA APPEARED

Now we can consider why Krsna decided to come and play His pastimes. Mother Earth became over-burdened with the sinful activities of the demoniac people headed by Kamsa. She could not bear this torture and went to Lord Brahma pleading for help. Lord Brahma told Mother Earth he could not do anything because Kamsa was a very demoniac personality. He

was so powerful that noone, not even the

demigods, could do anything against him.

And who is Kamsa? He is a demon named Kalnemi, the son of Hiranyaksa. He performed great austerities to please Lord Siva and become immortal. He offered oblations into a sacrificial fire for many thousands of years while standing on his head. When Lord Siva was pleased, he appeared before Kamsa and Kamsa asked for the benediction of immortality.

Lord Siva told Kamsa he could not give that benediction because no one can be immortal in this material nature. However, Lord Siva told Kamsa, "only one person will be able to kill you - the eighth son of someone who is very dear to you". Kamsa doubted that the son of someone very dear to him would actually kill him, so he accepted this benediction and became virtually immortal just like Hiranyakashipu.

Because of this benediction there was noone powerful enough to kill Kamsa. Therefore, (continued page four)

Mother Earth, Lord Brahma and the demigods went to the Supreme Lord, Ksirodakasayi Visnu, and offered prayers.

Hearing these prayers, Ksirodakasayi Visnu woke from his yoganidra. He became very angry when He learnt of Mother Earth's plight. "Why do these demigods give all kinds of benedictions to the demons? It causes so much disturbance to the earth planet and then you come to Me to solve your problems." Being angry at the distress caused to His devotees, Ksirodakasayi Visnu agreed to appear as the eighth son of Devaki and kill Kamsa.

Ksirodakasayi Visnu then instructed the demigods to also take birth on the earth planet before Him and assist Him in His pastimes. There is an underlying principle behind this instruction to the demigods.

When one develops his attachment and love for Krsna, he becomes eligible to go back to Godhead. But the way to the spiritual sky is through the earth planet. Therefore, Krsna allows qualified souls to take birth on the earth planet when He is due to appear and then takes them back to His eternal pastimes in the spiritual sky.

When Krsna performs His pastimes, His eternal associates come with Him. However, He also invites certain living entities who have understood their eternal loving relationship with Him. He allows them to develop their final attachment to Him by participating in His pastimes on the earth planet. This gives them the final qualification they need to go back to the spiritual sky.

Many demigods are recruited in this way. For example, Indra came as Arjuna; Yamaraj came as Vidura; Vayu came as Bhima and Vasu came as Bhisma.

KRSNA'S BIRTH

There is an interesting point concerning Krsna's birth. Although it appears that Mother Yasoda gave birth to one child, a daughter, Jiva Goswami points out that in *Harivamsa* and *Brahma Vivarta Purana*, it says Mother Yasoda actually gave birth to two children, one son and one daughter. The son is original Krsna and the daughter is Yogamaya.

Mother Yasoda gave birth to original Krsna but Vasudeva-Krsna, the son of Vasudeva and Devaki, became one with original Krsna, the son of Mother Yasoda. Srila Rupa Goswami mentioned in Laghu Bhagavatamrita;

krsno ʻnyo yadu-sambhuto yah purnah so ʻsty atah parah vrndavanam parityajya sa kvacin naiva gacchati

"The Krsna who was born in the Yadu dynasty (and who manifests Hispastimes in Mathura and Dwarka) is different from the Krsna, the full Personality of Godhead, (known as the son of Nanda Maharaja) who never at any time leaves Vrndaban."

It has also been mentioned, "Krsna the son of Yasoda, Krsna the son of Nanda, Krsna the moon of Vrndavana." This Krsna must be the original Krsna of Vrndavana and the original Krsna of Vrndavana is the son of Mother Yasoda. Therefore, Mother Yasoda actually gave birth to a son and that son is original Krsna.

When Vasudeva brought Vasudeva-Krsna (Devaki's son) to the house of Nanda Maharaja, Vasudeva-Krsna and original Krsna (Mother

Yasoda's son) became one and This Krsna of Vrndavana is the son of Masoda, "It has also been mentioned, "Krsna, the son of Yasoda, Muni explained the original Krsna of Vrndavana and the original Krsna of Vrndavana is the son of Mother Yasoda."

Vasudeva then picked up Mother Yasoda's daughter, Yogamaya, and took her to the prison of Kamsa.

PERSONALITIES APPEARING WITH KRSNA

1. NANDA MAHARAJA AND MOTHER YASODA

Who are Nanda Maharaja and Mother Yasoda? They were two vasus named Drona and Dhara. Drona became Nanda Maharaja and Dhara became Mother Yasoda. In their previous lives Drona and Dhara performed great austerities for a very long time because they wanted to seethe Supreme Personality of Godhead, Krsna.

When Krsna did not appear to them, they became so dejected they decided to give up their lives. They lit a huge fire and were about to enter into the flames when they heard a voice in the sky

saying, "Drona and Dhara, do not give up your bodies untimely. Be patient and you will get the Supreme Personality of Godhead, Krsna, as your son. When Krsna appears in Gokula, you will be his father and mother."

Drona and Dhara were very happy to hear this and in due course of time became Nanda Maharaja and Mother Yasoda.

2. BALARAMA

The next personality is Balarama. In Ramachandra's pastimes Balarama was Laksman and in Krsna's pastimes, this Laksman is Balarama. When Ramachandra came back to Ayodhya, everyone was very happy and were glorifying Lord Ramachandra for His wonderful activities of killing Ravana and rescuing Sita Devi.

At this time the great sage Agastya Muni said, "Actually, the credit for killing Ravana and rescuing Sita does not go to Rama, it goes to Laksman." Hearing this everyone asked Agastya Muni, "How is that possible? It was Lord Rama who killed Ravana and did so many other wonderful things."

Ravana's son, Meghnad, was invincible. No one, including the demigods, could defeat him and to defeat Ravana would have been impossible if Meghnad was alive. However, this Meghnad was killed by Laksman and Laksman was able to kill Meghnad because he was a perfect brahmachari and also did not eat anything for the fourteen years he was in the forest.

Lord Rama, the Supreme Personality of God head, out of His pastimes, challenged Agastya Muni by saying, "How is that possible? Sita was in the forest and a perfect *brahmachari* means one who does not even look at the face of a woman." Agastya Muni replied that Laksman did not look at the face of Sita, he looked only at her feet. Laksman admitted this was true.

Ramachandra then challenged Agastya Muni by saying, "You said Laksman did not eat

anything for fourteen years but everyday I personally gave him fruit. How can you say that he did not eat?" Laksman then said, "Actually, when You gave me the fruit, I used to return them to the forest."

Lord Ramachandra questioned Laksman, "Is this true?" and then instructed Hanuman, "Go to the forest and collect all the fruits. We will soon see if Laksman is telling the truth."

Hanuman went to the forest and returned with all the fruits. Everyone was very excited and were saying, "How wonderful it is that Laksman did not eat anything for fourteen years."

Ramachandra is the Supreme Personality of Godhead and He knows everything, but to enhance His pastimes He continued challenging Agastya Muni's statements about Laksman. Lord Rama counted all the fruits and found five were missing. The number of fruits were 14 years x365 days minus 5. Lord Rama asked Laksman, "How come five fruits are missing? You must have eaten on these five days."

Laxman then said, "My dear Lord Rama, if You remember You forgot to give me fruit on five days. Those five days were the day we got the news of our father's death, the day Sita was stolen, the day I was struck by `shakti shell', the day You went to Patalaloka to help to kill Mahiravana and the day Sita was tested in the fire. On those days You did not give me any fruit. This is why five fruits are missing."

Hearing this everyone started to glorify Laksman for His wonderful activities and Ramachandra was so moved, He told Laksman, "In My next pastimes I will allow you to become My elder brother." This is how Laksman appeared as Balarama in Krsna's pastimes.

3. RADHARANI'S APPEARANCE

In the beginning I mentioned how Srila Rupa Goswami's drama, *Lalita-Madhava*, describes Radharani appearing as the daughter of Vindya mountain. This is a very interesting story.

Parvati is the daughter of Himalayan mountain and she became the wife of Lord Siva. Vindya mountain was very upset about that. He became envious and wanted a daughter who would have a son-in-law greater than Lord Siva. He performed many austerities and sacrifices

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
